

## **Draft Ordinance No. .... of 2016**

### **Examinations Leading to the Degree of Bachelor of Commerce, Bachelor or Commerce Honors, Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA)**

(Under section 28(1) ( C) of the Madhya Pradesh Act No 17 of 2007)

Whereas it is expedient to provide an Ordinance in respect of Examinations leading to the Degree of Bachelor of commerce (B.Com) (Three Year Degree Course, Semester pattern), Bachelor of Commerce Honors (B.Com Honors) (Three Year Degree Course, Semester pattern) and Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) (Three Year Degree Course, Semester pattern), for the purpose hereinafter appearing, the Vice-Chancellor is hereby pleased to make the following Ordinance.

1. This Ordinance may be called “Examinations leading to the Degree of Bachelor of Commerce, Bachelor or Commerce Honors, Bachelor of Business Administration (All Three Year Degree Course, Semester pattern), Ordinance, 2016”.
2. This Ordinance shall come into force from the date of its making by the Vice-Chancellor.
3. The following shall be the examinations, leading to the Degree of Bachelor of Commerce namely :-
  - (i) the B.Com. Part-I (Semester I and Semester II);
  - (ii) the B.Com. Part-II (Semester III and Semester IV); and
  - (iii) the B.Com. Final (Semester V and Semester VI).
4. (i) There shall be Six Semester Pattern Examinations leading to the Degree of Bachelor of Commerce (First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth & Sixth, Semester B.Com.)
  - (ii) For the purposes of instructions and examinations the student shall study sequentially.
5. The main examination of first, third and fifth semester B.Com. shall be held by the University in winter & supplementary examination in summer every year. Main

examination of second, fourth and sixth semester B. Com. shall be held in summer & the supplementary examination in winter every year.

6. The period of Academic Session shall be such as may be notified by the University.
7. The following shall be examinations leading to the Degree of Bachelor of Commerce (Honors), ie. B.Com. (Honors) namely :-
  - (i) B.Com. (Honors) Part-I(Semester I and Semester II);
  - (ii) B.Com. (Honors) Part-II (Semester III and Semester IV); and
  - (iii) B.Com. (Honors) Final (Semester V and Semester VI).
8. (i) There shall be Six Semester Pattern Examinations leading to the Degree of Bachelor of Commerce Honors (First, Second,Third, Fourth , Fifth & Sixth, Semester B.Com. Honors)
  - (iii) For the purposes of instructions and examinations the student shall study sequentially.
9. The main examination of first, third and fifth semester B.Com. Honors shall be held by the University in winter & supplementary examination in summer every year. Main examination of second, fourth and sixth semester B. Com. Honors shall be held in summer & the supplementary examination in winter every year.
10. The following shall be the examinations, leading to the Degree of Bachelor of Business Administration namely :-
  - (iv) the B.B.A. Part-I;
  - (v) the B.B.A. Part-II; and
  - (vi) the B.B.A. Final.
11. (i) There shall be Six Semester Pattern Examinations leading to the Degree of Bachelor of Business Administration (First, Second,Third, Fourth , Fifth & Sixth, Semester B.B.A.)
  - (iv) For the purposes of instructions and examinations the student shall study sequentially.
12. The main examination of first, third and fifth semester B.B.A. shall be held by the University in winter & supplementary examination in summer every year. Main examination of second, fourth and sixth semester B. B.A. shall be held in summer & the supplementary examination in winter every year.
13. The Examinations specified in the preceding paragraphs, shall be held at such places and on such dates as may be declared by the Board of examinations.

14. Subject to compliance with the provisions of this Ordinance and of other Ordinances in force from time to time, an applicant for admission to :-
- A) the B.Com. Part-I, B.Com Honors Part I and B.B.A. Part I Examination shall have:-
- i) passed the 12<sup>th</sup> Standard Examination of the Any Indian State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education with English at higher or Lower level and Modern Indian Language at Higher or Lower level with any combination of optional subjects.
- OR**
- XII Standard Examination of Any Indian State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education in Vocational Stream with one language only,
- OR**
- ii) been successful at the Intermediate (10+2 Pattern) Examination of the University,
- B) The B.Com. Part-II, B.Com (Honors) Part-II and BBA Part-II Examinations shall have:-
- i) passed the B.Com. Part-I, B.Com (Honors) Part-I and B.B.A Part-I Examination of the University, respectively with English as one of the subjects of passing or an examination.
- ii) B.Com. Final Examination shall have passed B.Com. Part-II Examination of this University, similarly B.Com. (Honors) Final Examination, shall have passed B.Com. (Honors) part-II Examination of the University; and BBA (Final) Examination shall have passed BBA part II Examination of the University.
15. A collegiate candidate shall have prosecuted a regular course of study for not less than one academic year before being admitted to B.Com. Part-I or the B.Com. Part-II or B.Com. Final Examination, similarly for B.Com. (Honors), B.B.A courses respectively.
16. The fee for each of the examinations shall be as prescribed by University from time to time.
17. The teaching and the Examination scheme for first year of B.Com., B.Com (Hons) and B.B.A courses (Semester I & Semester II) shall be as appended in Appendix to this ordinance.
18. The scope the subject shall be indicated in syllabi.

19.
  - a) There shall be no classification of examinees successful at the B.Com. Part-I and the B.Com. Part-II Examinations, similarly for B.Com (Hon.) Part I, B Com Honors Part II , B.B. A. Part I and B.B.A. Part II Examinations, there shall be no classification of examinees.
  - b) Grades at the B.Com. Final Examination shall be declared on the basis of the aggregate marks at the B.Com. Part-I Examination, the B.Com. Part-II Examination and the B.Com. Final Examinations taken together, similarly for B.Com. (Hons.) and B.B.A. shall be followed.
  - c) Examinee who has been successful in completing all six semesters of respective degree course opeted as B.Com., B.Com (Hons); or B.B.A. examinations under this ordinance will be awarded grades as per SGPA/CGPA ordinance.
20. As soon as possible after the examination, the Board of examinations shall publish a result of examinees.
21. The re-examination for the unsuccessful candidates shall be conducted within one month after the results. The unsuccessful candidates shall register for re-examination within 10 days of declaration of the result. The result of re-examination shall be declared in fifteen days after conduct of the re-examination.
22. Provision of Ordinance relating to the Condonation of Deficiency of Marks for Passing an Examination and of Ordinance relating to grant of Exemptions and Compartment shall apply to the Examinations under this Ordinance.
23. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Ordinance, no person shall be admitted to an examination under this ordinance, if he has already passed the same examination or an equivalent examination of any other University.
24. Examinees successful at B.Com. Part-I Examination, B. Com Honors Part I Examination, B.B.A. Part I Examination; the B.Com. Part-II Examination, B. Com Honors Part II Examination, B.B.A. Part II Examination, shall be entitled to receive a certificate signed by the Registrar and those passing the B.Com. Final Examinations, B. Com Honors Final Examinations and B.B.A. Final Examinations, shall, on payment of the prescribed fees, receive a Degree in the prescribed form signed by the Vice-Chancellor.

(Statement of object and Reasons)

The University is conducting Bachelor of Commerce, Bachelor of Commerce Honors and Bachelor of Business Administration Courses in the Faculty of Commerce and Management. It is necessary to prepare an ordinance to regulate the above mentioned courses, hence this draft Ordinance is prepared for its consideration and making by the Vice-Chancellor as provided under section 28 of the Madhya Pradesh Act No, 17 of 2007 and for its onward submission to the Regulatory Commission.
