

Draft Ordinance No. of 2016

Examinations leading to the Degree of Master of Business Administration

(M.B.A.) Ordinance, 2016

(Under section 28(1) (C) of the Madhya Pradesh Act No 17 of 2007)

Whereas it is expedient to provide an ordinance in respect of the examinations leading to the Degree of Master of Business Administration for the purpose hereinafter appearing, the Vice-Chancellor is hereby pleased to make the following ordinance.

1. This Ordinance may be called “Examinations leading to the Degree of Master of Business Administration (M.B.A.) Ordinance., 2016”.
2. This Ordinance shall come into force from the date of its making by the Vice-Chancellor.
3. (A) (I) The Examinations leading to the Post-Graduate Degree Course in Business Administration (M.B.A.) shall be held every year at such places and on such dates as may be declared by the Vice-Chancellor.
(II) Subject to his compliance with the provision of this Ordinance and of any other Ordinances in force from time to time an applicant for admission to the Part-I Examination of the M.B.A. Course shall have-
 - i) been admitted to a Bachelor’s Degree of the University or of any other Statutory University.
 - ii) Prosecuted a regular course of study for not less than one Academic Year in a College or Department recognized for the purpose by the University.
4. Notwithstanding anything contained in any Ordinance and Regulation medium of instructions as well as medium of Examination of all the papers including dissertation and Viva-voce shall be English.
5. An applicant for the Examination prosecuting a regular course of study leading to the Degree of Master of Business Administration shall not seek admission to any other course in this University or any other University or shall not appear at any Examination of this University or any other University in the same academic session. Contravention of this shall result in cancellation of his/her admission to the course of Master in Business Administration.

6. An applicant for admission to the Examination for M.B.A. Part-II course shall have passed M.B.A. Part-I Examination of the University and shall have prosecuted a regular course of study for not less than one academic year.
7. The scheme of Teaching and Examinations shall be as prescribed under appendix appended with this ordinance.
8.
 - (I) Three copies of dissertation (Printed or typewritten) shall be submitted to the University through the Supervisor of the candidate and the Head of School/Institute at least a fortnight prior to the date of commencement of the written examination.
 - (II) (a) A candidate shall submit with his dissertation, a certificate from the Supervisor to the effect:-
 - i) that the candidate has satisfactorily conducted research for not less than one academic year;
 - ii) that the dissertation is of sufficiently high standard to warrant its presentation for examination.
 - iii) Candidate shall submit his declaration that the dissertation is the result of his own research work and the same has not been previously submitted to any examination of this University, or any other University. The dissertation shall be liable to be rejected and/or cancelled if found otherwise.
9. The scope of the subjects shall be as indicated in the syllabus.
10. (I) An examinee getting D grade in internal assessment and or Dissertation will be allowed to improve his grade by taking additional assignment and/or practicals and submitting them to the teachers.
(II) An examinee getting D grade in Dissertation will be allowed to improve his grade by submitting a fresh Dissertation.
11. An examinee who is unsuccessful at the examination shall be eligible for admission to the examination on payment of a fresh fee prescribed for the examination together with an

Ex-student fee as prescribed by University and on compliance with the conditions of the Ordinance in force from time to time.

12. (i) There shall be no classification of successful examinees at the Part-I Examination.
- (ii) An Examinee who has been successful in completing all four semester M.B.A. Examinations under this ordinance will be awarded Grades as per SGPA / CGPA ordinance.
13. Provisions of Ordinance relating to condonation of Deficiency of Marks for Passing in Examination and of Ordinance relating to Exemptions and Compartment shall apply to the examination under his ordinance.
14. As soon as possible after the examination Board of Examinations shall publish a result of examinees. The result of all examinations shall be classified as per the ordinance or results of an examination.
15. The re-examination for the unsuccessful candidates shall be conducted within one month after the results. The unsuccessful candidates shall register for re-examination within 10 days of declaration of the result. The result of re-examination shall be declared in fifteen days after conduct of the re-examination.
16. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this ordinance, no person shall be admitted to this examination if he has already passed the same examination or an examination of any other Statutory University which has been recognized as equivalent to that examination.
17. Examinees successful at the M.B.A. Part-II Examination, shall on payment of the prescribed fee, receive a Degree in the prescribed form signed by the Vice-Chancellor.

(Statement of object and Reasons)

The University is conducting MBA Course in the Faculty of Commerce and Management. It is necessary to prepare an ordinance to regulate the above mentioned course, hence this draft Ordinance is prepared for its consideration and making by the Vice-Chancellor as provided under section 28 of the Madhya Pradesh Act No, 17 of 2007 and for its onward submission to the Regulatory Commission.
